Background

- ANU has 4 campuses (Junied, old campus, hisham hijjawi & Khadoori)
- Total # of students in all campuses is around 20000
- Students at ANU usually come from north of West Bank however there are also small % from middle ,south and from diaspora
- There are 3 clinics that serve students health needs
- (old campus, Junied & H. Hijjawi)
- Each has doctor and nurse except H. hijjawi(only doctor)
- Most of services are of urgent need type
- Average daily visits varies(10-40)







Study Objectives

- From Students' point of view:
- 1-Find health priorities
- 2- evaluate current university clinic services
- 3-Evaluate health providers at the clinics
- 4-Find health needs at the univ clinics

Methodolgy

- Sample: 250 students randomly selected from all colleges, including males and females, junior and senior students from 3 campuses
- Tool a modified standardized translated questionnaire containing the following components:
- 1- demographic profile
- 2-openion about clinic utilization
- 3-openion about health providers at clinics
- 4-openion about priorities
- 5-openion about personal health

Opinion about clinics utilization

- 54% --need clinic,45% <5/y,50% for urgent</p>
- Average waiting time 5 min
- Satisfaction:
- 75%--+ waiting area,86%no financial burden,80% --no gender bias
- 50% --no brochure, 25%--no privacy,44%--no vitals
- 80% --believe—need for social /psychological counselor
- 30-40%--enough info about clinic operation and different interventions

Opinion about health providers

- Doctor :
- 60%-- prefer--female
- > 50%--doctor in clinic –professional,65% treated with respect, problems are explained,they comply with advice, 54%--+privacy

Opinion about health providers

- Nurses:
- 80%-- prefer--female
- > 60%--nurse in clinic –professional
- 75% treated with respect

- Top 5 priorities—54%

- Sports counseling:
- **#10---19.2**
- #9---16%
- **#1--- 16.4%**

- Dental Health
- Menstrual period and related problems

Least priorities

- Chronic diseases treatment and counseling
- Allergies ,asthma sinuses and related problems
- Reproductive health

Opinion about priorities in relation to variables

- No statistically significant relationship at P≤0.05 except
- Gender: with nutrition(p=0.009), with acne(p=0.01)
- College type: with addiction(p=0.01), with allergy(p=0.01)
- Class level —with sports (p=0.01), with addiction
- Social status
- Current residence —with addiction(p=0.01)
- Permanent residence
- Family income

Reproductive health education

- 86% --no enough education about RH
- 71%---If + education —it is non curricular
- Age of RH education:
- **28%--15-16** y old
- 21% --18 y old

Source of health info

- Source of youth health info:
- 36%--internet
- 18%---TV
- 25%--brochures
- 9%--friends
- 10%--other sources

Self evaluation

- Physically:
- 35%--excellent
- 28%--occasional symptoms
- 28%--occasional mild illness
- 6% --average health
- 1%--physically ill—need special medical care

Self evaluation

- Psychologically
- 34.5%--excellent
- 23.2%--occasional symptoms
- 30%--occasional problems
- 5%-- moderate problems—needs some care
- 5%--severe problems—needs extensive care

Conclusion

- From ANU Students' point of view:
- ANU clinics are providing acceptable professional urgent medical care
- Both doctors and nurses are professional and their care is of good satisfaction
- ANU clinics need modification to meet international standards of youth friendly clinics
- Priorities are mainly dealing with psychological stressors beside other health needs
